

William "Ted" Anglyn, MAI, Honored at the International Valuation Conference for the Appraisal Institute's Lifetime Achievement Award

Anglyn is heavily involved in his local community with many charitable and civic causes including serving at Hampton Elementary School and Habitat for Humanity of Cobb County, and being a sponsor of Nurses Week at Grady Memorial Hospital and the Joseph Ferry Baptist Church Middle School Choir. He also is a member of the Parking Consultant Council with the National Parking Association, and is a founding board member of the Buckhead (Carl Sanders) YMCA.

Anglyn served on the Appraisal Institute's national Board of Directors from 2000-02, and on various national committees and subcommittees, including the Finance Committee, Nominating Committee, Seminars Subcommittee and Continuing Professional Development Subcommittee. He was president of the Atlanta Area Chapter in 1999, vice president in 1998, secretary in 1997 and treasurer, Finance Committee chair and Education Committee chair in 1996. He also has been actively involved in the Appraisal Institute's Leadership Development and Advisory Council conference, where an annual award is given in his honor.
