Requirements for Scholarship Award

1. Applicant must be a Candidate for Designation or a Practicing Affiliate of the Atlanta Area Chapter of the Appraisal Institute in good standing, working toward an MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, or AI-RRS designation.
2. Applicant must have attended a minimum of two Quarterly Atlanta Area Chapter Meetings within the past eighteen months. The following programs may be substituted for a Quarterly Chapter Meeting: Annual State of Atlanta Conference, ½ day Chapter sponsored seminar held the day of the Chapter Meeting, and Chapter Networking Social Events. Provide dates of the meetings/events.
3. Applicant must submit a list of completed Appraisal Institute courses and continuing education to date and a summary of remaining classes needed for designation and the cost of those classes.
4. Applicant must submit a resume or statement of qualifications. Please list most recent employment first. Applicant must state if he/she is a previous scholarship recipient of this award.
5. Applicant is asked to list any Honors, Awards or Distinctions and any extracurricular activities and affiliations with other professional organizations.

6. Applicant is asked to list any volunteer or community service.
7. Applicant must submit an essay between a minimum of 200 words and a maximum of 500 words stating why he or she should be awarded the scholarship, highlighting professional goals and experience. In this essay, applicant should list educational plan for the MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, or AI-RRS designation.
8. Applicant must provide a letter of recommendation from current or previous employer.

Conditions for Scholarship Award

The Atlanta Area Chapter will award up to five scholarships of up to \$2,000 per scholarship. The Scholarship Committee will consider costs for each selected applicant's upcoming classes to maximize the scholarship award; however, the award may be structured to cover full class amounts with no residual award for partial class costs.

Scholarships may be applied only to Appraisal Institute core courses that are offered by the Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute and that are provided to qualify an individual for the MAI or SRA designation. Scholarships may be applied to selected continuing education offerings approved by the Scholarship Committee. Scholarship money will be paid directly, and only to the course provider, Atlanta Area Chapter Appraisal Institute. **Scholarship money is for course tuition fee, only. Scholarship award must be used within the 36 months following its award date.**

Only one scholarship may be awarded to an individual in any one award period.

Award recipients must submit either a course registration or written correspondence to the Chapter Executive Director stating his/her intention to attend the course, no later than 30 days before the start date of the intended course, for approval of use for scholarship funds.

Deadline to submit the application is July 15, 2018. The scholarships will be awarded no more than 30 days later. Persons awarded the scholarship will be asked to attend a specified Chapter meeting for the formal presentation announcement.

A photograph of the Applicant may be requested for publicity and promotional uses in the Chapter newsletter or AI National correspondence. Applicant will be notified by phone or email if a scholarship has or has not been awarded.

About Roy L. Gordon, Jr.

Roy Lachlison Gordon, Jr. passed away in Atlanta on September 14, 2017 at the age of eighty. Roy was born and grew up in Savannah and was a second-generation practitioner in the field of real estate and appraisal. After graduating from the University of Florida, he embarked on a very successful real estate career in Savannah which culminated in the commercial real estate brokerage and appraisal firm of Gordon & Simmons, Inc. with Roy's long-term partner Elliott B. Simmons, Jr. Roy moved to Atlanta, Ga around 1980 to assume Southeast regional responsibilities for the Cushman & Wakefield Appraisal Division and served in that capacity for approximately 25 years. Roy held both the CRE and MAI designations and made innumerable contributions to these professional organizations and the overall real estate appraisal profession through serving as officer/board member on a local and regional basis including President of the Savannah Board of Realtors and Savannah Area Chapter of the Society of Real Estate Appraisers and publishing many articles for professional trade journals. The Atlanta Area Chapter of the Appraisal Institute awarded Roy the Legion of Leaders Award for his lifelong dedication to the organization and appraisal profession. Roy was known for his unselfish dedication and patience and served as a mentor for innumerable young professionals who embarked upon successful real estate appraisal careers. Roy's professional practice was characterized by precision, consistency, reliability and an absolute dedication to the highest ethical and professional standards over the entire course of his career. On a personal note, Roy was an accomplished sailor and photographer and enjoyed traveling. Roy is survived by his wife Suzanne Schwalb Gordon and his daughters Amy Findley and Cathy Pirtle.
